Potential complementarities/Synergies with DINU Call

The work being done under the UNICEF Action will call for closer collaborations with identified partners under “**lot 1: improving livelihoods through increased production of diversified food, enhance market opportunities and improved maternal and child nutrition**” to harness synergies and ensure complementary of planned multi-sectoral nutrition Actions.

UNICEF has supported the development of DNAPs and SNAPs in 15 DINU districts for the FY 2018/2019 and 2019/2020.

UNICEF will continue supporting nutrition governance actions in 15 DINU districts.



More support from partners is required to:

- ▶ Develop a multi-year action plan 2020-2025 in the other 15 districts
- ▶ Support the implementation of action plans at subcounty and district levels, as outlined in the NAPs, by all different sectors (e.g. support education sector with implementation of nutrition comic book in primary schools, support agriculture sector with implementation of nutrition sensitive action plans)
- ▶ Design and implement a communication campaign and SBCC strategy for nutrition, health, ECD and WASH for DINU districts, in alignment to the national level
- ▶ Support nutrition-specific interventions implemented by health sector at district, facility and community levels; support integration of nutrition within health system; support implementation of health facility quality assessment.
- ▶ Ensure social protection schemes implemented in Northern Uganda have at least one secondary objective as nutrition
- ▶ Support districts with implementation of nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive interventions to improve dietary diversity among children and women.
- ▶ Special request to partners to include nutrition indicators that they want to contribute to (e.g. Minimum Dietary Diversity); ensure that partners design the interventions to produce measurable results related to nutrition
